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Chap. 589. AN ACT IN FAVOR OF JOHN F. KILEY OF THE CITY KNOWN AS THE TOWN OF METHUEN.

ACTS, 1981. - Chap. 590, 591.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the county commissioners of Essex county are hereby authorized to pay out of available funds the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars to John F. Kiley of the city known as the town of Methuen for the sum incurred for the necropsy performed on his son, James Kiley.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 590. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF DIRECTOR OF MAINTENANCE IN THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT IN THE TOWN OF RANDOLPH FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The position of director of maintenance in the school department of the town of Randolph shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the civil service status of any person holding civil service status in the position of director of maintenance in the school department of the town of Randolph on the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

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Chap. 591. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF DIRECTOR OF FOOD SERVICES IN THE TOWN OF RANDOLPH FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The position of director of food services in the school department of the town of Randolph shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the civil service status of any person holding civil service status in the position of director of food services in the school department of the town of Randolph on the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
