RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF J. ARTHUR BAKER.

Resolved, That the Senate expresses its sorrow at the sudden death of the late Judge J. Arthur Baker. Judge Baker served over fifteen years on the bench of the Superior Court, and had achieved a splendid reputation as a jurist. As a practicing attorney, member of the Governor's Council, and judge he was ever active in public affairs. A native of Cape Cod, and a former resident of Pittsfield, representing the western part of the Commonwealth in the Executive Council, he was well known throughout the Commonwealth and had won many friends. The members of the Senate take this occasion to express their sincere sympathy with the widow of the late Judge Baker in her great loss; and be it further
