SENATE, October 4, 1951.

*Ordered*, That the joint committee on Ways and Means is hereby authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of current house document numbered 2823, relative to providing higher educational opportunities for children of Massachusetts men and women who died in the armed forces of the United States or as a result of such service. Said committee shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the first Wednesday in December of the current year.
