the division of capital planning pursuant to section ten of chapter five hundred and seventy-nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and eighty, is hereby authorized to transfer the care, custody and control of the public lands, under the control of the department of environmental management, hereinafter described, or such portions thereof as may be necessary, to the department of public works, and that the said department of public works is hereby authorized to divert said hereinafter described public lands from their present public uses to highway uses, as hereinafter provided.

Said public lands to be so transferred consists of a rectangular parcel of land shown on a map entitled "Plan of Land in Sandwich Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Forests and Parks Department of Environmental Management dated August 1, 1980", which map said department of public works is hereby directed to file with the office of the chief engineer of the said department, and which parcel is bounded and described as follows:-

A certain parcel of rectangular-shaped land approximately two hundred (200) feet southwesterly of state auto route 130 adjoining a department of public works maintenance site at or about station 45.00 of the said state auto route 130 and thence running southwesterly about two hundred (200) feet, thence turning and running northwesterly about five hundred twenty (520) feet, thence turning and running northeasterly about two hundred (200) feet, and thence turning and running southeasterly five hundred twenty (520) feet to the point of beginning. Containing in all approximately one hundred four thousand (104,000) square feet of land, more or less.

The above-described parcel of land is a portion of the Sandwich State Forest, and is vacant land. Said land shall be used by the department of public works for a maintenance depot in connection with highway purposes.

Chap. 710. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE INVESTMENT OF COMMONWEALTH FUNDS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 38 of chapter 29 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

The treasurer may lend securities purchased from funds authorized by this section, provided that at the time of the execution of the loan at least one hundred per cent of the market value of the security lent shall be secured by cash or securities guaranteed by the United States government or any agency of the United States government. At all times during the term of each such loan the collateral shall be equal to not less than ninety-five per cent of the full market value of the security and said collateral shall not be more than one hundred thousand dollars less than the full market value of the security.

Chap. 711. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF PENSIONERS AFTER RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Paragraph (\underline{b}) of section 91 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in chapter 587 of the acts of 1973, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 15 and 16, the words "ninety days, or seven hundred and twenty" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- one hundred and twenty days, or nine hundred and sixty.

Chap. 712. AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROBATION OFFICER DISABILITY RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Kenneth T. Rainey, probation officer in the Springfield Court, Trial Division, is hereby on the pension rolls of the Contributory Retirement System for Public Employees. For his fifteen years of service and because of his physical disability, he shall receive an annual pension equal to one-half of the average of his salaries during his last three years of fulltime work occurring before his retirement. His pension shall begin on the date hereafter on which his retirement begins.

Chap. 713. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' SERVICES TO PAY A CERTAIN SUM OF MONEY TO THE TOWN OF FLORIDA FOR CERTAIN VETERANS' BENEFITS PAID BY SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:
