RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE ARREST, SERVICE OF WARRANTS AND DETENTION OF PERSONS FOR MOTOR VEHICLE VIOLATIONS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 two members of the senate to be designated by the president
3 thereof, three members of the house of representatives to be
4 designated by the speaker thereof, and one person to be
5 appointed by the governor, is hereby established for the pur-
6 pose of making an investigation and study of the arrest,
7 service of warrants and detention of persons for motor vehicle
8 violations.

9 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the
10 state house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may require by
11 summons the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the
12 production of books and papers, may travel within the com-
13 monwealth, and may expend for legal, clerical and other
14 assistance and for expenses such sums as may be appropriated
15 therefor. Said commission shall report to the general court
16 the results of its investigation and study, and its recommenda-
17 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to
18 carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with
19 the clerk of the house of representatives not later than the
20 first Wednesday of February in the year nineteen hundred
21 and fifty-seven.
