AN ACT RELATIVE TO ASSESSMENT OF CERTAIN CHARGES INCURRED
IN THE OPERATION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 Any sums paid to the Metropolitan Transit Authority by
2 the commonwealth on account of a deficiency, together with
3 interest and other charges incurred in borrowing the money
4 therefor, shall be assessed in the following manner: — Seventy-
5 five per cent thereof shall be assessed on the cities and towns
6 constituting the Authority as provided by section twenty of
7 chapter fifty-nine of the General Laws, in proportion to the
8 amounts paid under the last preceding assessment under sec-
9 tion fourteen of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the
10 special acts of nineteen hundred and eighteen or under sec-
11 tion thirteen of chapter five hundred and forty-four of the acts
12 of nineteen hundred and forty-seven, and twenty-five per
13 cent thereof shall be assessed on the following cities and towns
14 contiguous to the territory of cities and towns comprising the
15 Authority, to wit: — Canton, Dedham, Lexington, Melrose,
16 Needham, Quincy, Randolph, Saugus, Stoneham, Waltham,
17 Wellesley, Weston, Winchester and Winthrop, in proportion
18 to the population of such contiguous cities and towns.
