AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT IN THE CASE OF LOSS OF HEARING IN ONE OR BOTH EARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (g) of section 36 of chapter 152
2 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by adding at the
3 end the following sentence:— For any permanent but par-
4 tial loss or reduction in hearing of both or either ear such
5 period of weeks in proportion to the period applicable in the
6 event of total loss as the partial loss or reduction bears to
7 such total loss.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
