AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF LYNN TO PAY A SUM OF
MONEY TO HELEN M. WHALEN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public good,
2 and in consideration of the long and efficient service of Thomas
3 J. Whalen as a member of the city of Lynn fire department,
4 said city may appropriate and pay to Helen M. Whalen,
5 widow of said Thomas J. Whalen, so long as she shall re-
6 main unmarried, a payment not to exceed fifteen hundred
7 dollars per year, the same to be paid in equal monthly in-
8 stallments for the rest of her life.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance
2 during the current year by vote of the city council of said
3 city subject to the provisions of its charter.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

1. Section 1. For the purpose of promoting the public good,
2. and the efficiency of the laws and official services of the
3. State, the Governor may, at his discretion, and with the
4. approval of the Council, appoint and pay to the said
5. Governor, or to any other person, a salary not exceeding
6. the sum of one thousand dollars per annum, for the
7. term of one year, or for such shorter period as the
8. Council may determine.

1. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage,
2. and the Council may, at any time, amend or repeal the
3. same, subject to the provisions of the Constitution.
