AN ACT RELATIVE TO TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS UNDER THE
CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Any employee holding a position under the classified pub-
- 2 lic service to which he was appointed on a temporary basis
- 3 shall, upon holding said position for more than one year, be
- 4 certified for said position and shall be deemed to be perma-
- 5 nently appointed thereto without being required to serve any
- 6 probationary period.
