AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF CHARLES C. PHILBROOK, A FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWN OF COHASSET.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. To promote the public good, the retirement
2 allowance of Charles C. Philbrook, a former employee of the
3 town of Cohasset, is hereby increased in the amount of three
4 hundred dollars per annum.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance
2 to the voters of said town at the next annual town meeting,
3 in the form of the following question, which shall be placed
4 upon the official ballot to be used for the election of town
5 officers at said town meeting:— “Shall the retirement allow-
6 ance of Charles C. Philbrook, a former employee of the town
7 of Cohasset, be increased in the amount of three hundred
8 dollars per annum?” If a majority of votes in answer to
9 said question is in the affirmative, then this act shall there-
10 upon take full effect, but not otherwise.
