AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF CERTAIN JUSTICES OF THE  
SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 333 of the acts of 1956 is hereby  
2 amended by striking out section 2 and inserting in place  
3 thereof the following section:—

4 *Section 2.* This act shall take effect as of October first,  
5 nineteen hundred and fifty-five.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section  
2 four of chapter seven hundred and thirty-three of the acts  
3 of nineteen hundred and fifty-five, any justice of the supreme  
4 judicial court who was appointed to said office between the  
5 first day of January and the thirty-first day of December in  
6 the year nineteen hundred and fifty-six, both dates inclusive,  
7 shall receive such salary as is provided by section twenty-  
8 two of chapter two hundred and eleven of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 3. Section two of this act shall take effect as of  
2 January first, nineteen hundred and fifty-six.

The Constitution of the State of New York

Article 1. The Legislative Department shall consist of a Senate and an Assembly.

Section 1. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four members, who shall be chosen for the term of two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 2. The Assembly shall be composed of fifty-five members, who shall be chosen for the term of two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 3. The members of the Senate shall be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.

Section 4. The members of the Assembly shall be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.

Section 5. The members of the Senate shall be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.

Section 6. The members of the Assembly shall be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.
