AN ACT ESTABLISHING A PERMANENT COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF STUDYING AND MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GENERAL COURT RELATIVE TO COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 There is hereby established a permanent commission, to
2 consist of seven persons to be appointed by the governor,
3 which shall serve under the governor and council, and shall
4 be subject to such supervision as the governor and council
5 deem necessary and proper. Said commission shall make a
6 study and investigation relative to all phases of compulsory
7 motor vehicle liability insurance in the commonwealth. It
8 shall report to the general court, from time to time, such
9 recommendations for changes in, or additions to, the laws
10 relating to said liability insurance as it may deem necessary
11 or advisable. Said commission is hereby authorized to re-
12 quire the production of such books, records and papers as it
13 may deem helpful in carrying out its duties.

The Commission of Massachusetts

AN ACT to establish a permanent commission to study the organization of the judicial system, and to make reports relative thereto to the General Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. There is hereby established a permanent commission, to consist of seven persons, to be appointed by the Governor, and which shall have under the Governor and Council, and shall be subject to such supervision as the Governor and Council may direct, and report, all such information as may be necessary and convenient for the study and investigation relative to the organization of the judicial system, and the manner in which the same may be improved, and shall report to the General Court, from time to time, such recommendations for changes in or additions to the laws relating to the judicial system as it may deem necessary or advisable. Said commission is hereby authorized to receive the production of such books, records and papers as it may deem helpful in carrying out its duties.
