AN ACT AMENDING THE GROUP INSURANCE LAW FOR COUNTY AND CITY EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 10 of chapter 32B of chapter 730 of the acts and
2 resolves of 1956 is hereby repealed and a new section 10 is
3 inserted:—

4 *Section 10.* This chapter may be accepted in a county by
5 vote of the county commissioners; in a city by vote of the
6 city council; in a district by vote of the district at a district
7 meeting; and in a town by submission for acceptance to the
8 registered voters in the form of the following question which
9 shall be printed upon the official ballot to be used at an
10 election:—“Shall chapter thirty-two B of the General Laws,
11 authorizing any county, city, town or district to provide a
12 plan of group life insurance, group accidental death and
13 dismemberment insurance, and group general or blanket
14 hospital, surgical and medical insurance for certain persons
15 in the service of such county, city, town or district and their
16 dependents, be accepted by this town?” If a majority of
17 the voters voting on the question shall vote in the affirmative,
18 this chapter shall take effect in such town.
