## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Seven.

RESOLVE CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION TO INVESTIGATE THE EXISTENCE AND EXTENT OF ORGANIZED CRIME AND GAMBLING, AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS, WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission established  
2 by chapter one hundred of the resolves of nineteen hundred  
3 and fifty-three and most recently revived and continued by  
4 chapter one hundred and forty-seven of the resolves of  
5 nineteen hundred and fifty-five for the purpose of investi-  
6 gating and studying the existence and extent of organized  
7 crime and gambling, and related matters, the scope of its  
8 investigation and study having been increased by chapter  
9 one hundred and ten of the resolves of nineteen hundred and  
10 fifty-six to include the study and investigation of possible  
11 illegal wire tapping, is hereby continued and extended with all  
12 the powers, privileges and duties conferred upon it by said  
13 chapters, and subject to the provisions thereof other than  
14 the date required thereon for the filing of its report. Said  
15 commission shall report to the general court the results of its  
16 investigations and its recommendations, if any, together with  
17 drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations  
18 into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the senate  
19 from time to time, but not later than the first Wednesday of  
20 May, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
