AN ACT PROVIDING THAT UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT AMOUNTS PAID TO CLAIMANTS FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUND BE DEDUCTED FROM THE TOTAL BENEFIT AMOUNTS FOR WHICH SUCH CLAIMANTS WOULD BE OTHERWISE ELIGIBLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 29 of chapter 151A of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 719 of the acts of 1956, is hereby
3 further amended by adding thereto subsection (d), as fol-
4 lows: —

5 (d) An individual in total or partial unemployment and
6 otherwise eligible for benefits, but who is receiving compensa-
7 tion for such unemployment from a source or sources other
8 than the Massachusetts unemployment compensation fund,
9 shall have his regular weekly benefit amount reduced by such
10 amount as he is receiving from such other source or sources.
