AN ACT RESTORING CERTAIN RIGHTS UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter seven hundred
2 and nineteen of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-six,
3 those persons who (a) on October first, nineteen hundred and
4 fifty-six, would have been eligible for employment security
5 benefits under chapter one hundred and fifty-one A of the
6 General Laws, if chapter seven hundred and nineteen of the
7 acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-six had not been enacted;
8 and (b) were not eligible solely because of the change in the
9 definition of the "base period" by section one of said chapter
10 seven hundred and nineteen; and (c) file applications for
11 benefits within ninety days of the effective date of this act,
12 shall be eligible for benefits in accordance with the law effec-
13 tive at the time of filing, except that the base period used in
14 computing benefits shall commence on July first, nineteen
15 hundred and fifty-five, any provision of chapter one hundred
16 and fifty-one A of the General Laws, as amended, to the
17 contrary notwithstanding.
