AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROMOTIONS TO POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED OFFICIAL SERVICE OF THE COMMONWEALTH THE PRINCIPAL DUTY OF WHICH IS THE INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION OF THE GENERAL LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all promotions  
2 to positions in the classified official service of the common-  
3 wealth the principal duty of which is the interpretation and  
4 application of the General Laws, the names of attorneys-at-  
5 law admitted to practice in the courts of the commonwealth  
6 shall be placed first on the eligible list, in order of their chrono-  
7 logical admittance to the bar.
