AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN ASSISTANT CLERKS IN CERTAIN COURTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 80, as most recently amended
3 by section 3A of chapter 768 of the acts of 1951, and in-
4 serting in place thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 80.* In courts in which the salaries of clerks are
6 established by section seventy-nine, the salaries of first as-
7 sistant clerks shall be equal to seventy-five per cent, and the
8 salaries of all other assistant clerks shall be equal to seventy
9 per cent of the salaries of the clerks of their respective courts,
10 except that the salaries of the first assistant clerks of the
11 first district court of eastern Middlesex, the third district
12 court of eastern Middlesex, the district court of East Norfolk,
13 the municipal court of the Roxbury district, the district
14 court of Springfield and the central district court of Worcester
15 shall be equal to eighty-five per cent of the salaries of the
16 clerks of their respective courts.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of July first, nine-
2 teen hundred and fifty-seven.
