AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TAXATION OF OUTSIDE TELEPHONE BOOTHS BY CITIES AND TOWNS AT THE ANNUAL RATE OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS EACH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 59 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 2 the following section:—
- 3 *Section 2A.* A tax of one hundred dollars per year is hereby
- 4 imposed on each outside telephone booth, such tax to be
- 5 paid to the city or town where the booth is located.
