RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ON TAXATION.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, known as
2 the special commission on taxation, established by chapter
3 eighty-six of the resolves of nineteen hundred and forty-
4 eight, and most recently revived and continued by chapter
5 of the resolves of nineteen hundred and fifty-
6 seven, shall, in making its investigation and study, consider
7 the subject matter of the study proposed by current house
8 document numbered 1601, relative to the tax problems, the
9 means of providing credit, technical assistance and aid to
10 small business in Massachusetts.
