## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF BARBERS SHALL NOT BE A MEMBER OF SAID BOARD AND PROVIDING THAT THE PRESENT SECRETARY OF SAID BOARD SHALL BE APPOINTED SECRETARY TO THE BOARD UPON THE TERMINATION OF HIS TERM OF OFFICE AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out section 40, as most recently amended  
3 by section 1 of chapter 299 of the acts of 1934, and inserting  
4 in place thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 40.* The board shall hold regular meetings at the  
6 state house on the first Tuesdays of January, May and Octo-  
7 ber in each year, and such additional meetings at such times  
8 and places as it may determine. At the regular meeting in  
9 January it shall annually organize by the choice of a chair-  
10 man, who shall be a member of the board. Said board shall  
11 appoint a secretary who shall not be a member of the board,  
12 and who shall before entering upon the discharge of the  
13 duties of his office give to the state treasurer a bond, with  
14 such sureties as shall be approved by the governor and council,  
15 conditioned upon the faithful discharge of his duties. Such  
16 bond, with the approval of the board and with the oath of  
17 office endorsed thereon, shall be filed in the office of the state  
18 secretary. The board shall have a common seal, and the mem-  
19 bers thereof may administer oaths. The board may appoint  
20 investigators who shall be citizens of the commonwealth,  
21 shall have had at least five years' continuous practical ex-  
22 perience as barbers, and are registered under section eighty-  
23 seven G of chapter one hundred and twelve. Said investi-

24 gators shall inspect barber shops, barber schools and barber  
25 colleges, and shall report to the board all violations of any  
26 law, rule or regulation relative to barbering.

1 SECTION 2. The present secretary of the board of regis-  
2 tration of barbers, Anthony J. Bellio, shall, notwithstanding  
3 the provisions of section one, serve until the end of the term  
4 for which he was appointed unless he sooner resigns as a  
5 member of said board. Upon the expiration of his term of  
6 office as a member of said board, or upon his resignation as a  
7 member thereof, the said board shall forthwith appoint said  
8 Anthony J. Bellio as secretary to the said board, and there-  
9 after his term of office shall be unlimited, but he may be re-  
10 moved therefrom for cause in the manner provided by section  
11 forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.
