AN ACT EXEMPTING CHARITABLE BOARDING HOMES FOR THE AGED FROM THE PAYMENT OF A FEE AND EXCISE ON THE IMPORTATION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The last sentence of section 22A of chapter 138 of the
2 General Laws, added by chapter 322 of the acts of 1955, is
3 hereby amended by inserting after the word "hospital", in
4 line 3, the words: — or boarding home for the aged, — so as
5 to read as follows: — No fee shall be fixed by the commission
6 and no excise shall be paid to the commonwealth in any case
7 where a charitable hospital or boarding home for the aged is
8 granted a permit to import alcoholic beverages which are
9 acquired otherwise than by purchase and are not intended
10 for sale.
