AN ACT

To require Towns to keep Main Highways free from Underbrush and Bushes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of all towns to keep
2 its main travelled roads free from underbrush and bushes
3 for a distance of not less than fifteen feet from the centre
4 of the road where the road curves in such manner that
5 the view is obstructed.

1 SECTION 2. Failure to comply with the provisions of
2 this act shall render the town liable for any accident re-
3 sulting directly or indirectly from the failure, and the
4 superior court of the county concerned is hereby given
5 authority to enforce the provisions of this act.
