RESOLVE

Requesting the Armory Commissioners to investigate the Desirability of acquiring and maintaining Rifle Ranges for the Militia.

1 *Resolved*, Under authority granted by chapter eight
2 hundred and twelve of the acts of the year nineteen hun-
3 dred and thirteen, the armory commissioners are hereby
4 requested to investigate the advisability of acquiring all
5 rifle ranges in the commonwealth which are at present in
6 use by the state militia. The commissioners shall report
7 to the next general court not later than the tenth day of
8 January, as to the probable cost to the commonwealth of
9 acquiring and maintaining said rifle ranges, with such
10 recommendations, if any, as they deem necessary to estab-
11 lish additional rifle ranges for the use of the militia and
12 as to the best locations for the same.
