AN ACT

Relative to the Law of the Road.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. When persons meet at an inter-
2 section of ways, except when traffic is under the
3 direction of a police officer in uniform, whether
4 travelling with carriages, wagons, carts, sleds,
5 sleighs, bicycles, motor vehicles, motorcycles or
6 other vehicles, those approaching from the right
7 shall have the right of way over those approaching
8 from the left.

1 SECTION 2. Any person violating section one
2 of this act shall be deemed prima facie negligent in
3 any civil action brought against him for damages
4 to property or injuries to persons resulting
5 therefrom.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on June
2 first, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

Approved by the Senate of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on the 10th day of February, 1903, and by the House of Representatives on the 12th day of February, 1903.
