AN ACT

Relative to Primary Officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section one hundred and two of
2 chapter eight hundred and thirty-five of the acts
3 of the year nineteen hundred and thirteen is
4 hereby amended by striking out said section and
5 inserting in place thereof the following:—*Sec-*
6 *tion 102.* No person shall be ineligible to act as
7 a primary officer because he is a candidate for
8 delegate to a convention, and except in Boston,
9 no person shall be ineligible to serve as a primary
10 officer because he is a candidate for or member
11 of a ward or town committee.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
