Bill accompanying the petition of Barnet Lerner relative to the suspension of the licenses of junk dealers. Legal Affairs. January 15.

AN ACT

Relative to Suspending the Licenses of Junk Dealers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twenty-nine of chapter one hundred and two
2 of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by striking out, in
3 line eight, all after the word "revoke", and inserting in
4 place thereof the following words:—or suspend such
5 licenses for such period of time as they may deem
6 proper,—so as to read as follows:—*Section 29.* The
7 mayor and aldermen of any city except Boston, and in
8 Boston, the board of police, and the selectmen of any
9 town, if ordinances or by-laws therefor have been adopted
10 in such city or town, may license suitable persons to be
11 dealers in and keepers of shops for the purchase, sale or
12 barter of junk, old metals or second-hand articles, in such
13 city or town, subject to the provisions of sections one
14 hundred and eighty-six to one hundred and eighty-nine,
15 inclusive, and may revoke or suspend such licenses for
16 such period of time as they may deem proper.
