RESOLVE

Extending the Time for the Report of the State Department of Health on the use of Water from the Ipswich River.

1 *Resolved*, That the time within which the state depart-
2 ment of health shall report to the general court the
3 results of its investigation relative to the use of water
4 from the Ipswich river, as required by chapter seventy-
5 three of the resolves of the year nineteen hundred and
6 seventeen, is hereby extended to the second Wednesday
7 in January of the year nineteen hundred and nineteen;
8 and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of
9 said chapter seventy-three the department may expend
10 a sum not exceeding seven hundred and fifty dollars in
11 addition to the sum authorized by said chapter seventy-
12 three of the resolves of the year nineteen hundred and
13 seventeen. The commonwealth shall be reimbursed for
14 the amount expended under authority of this resolve by
15 the cities of Beverly, Lynn, Peabody and Salem and the
16 town of Danvers, in proportion to the population of each
17 as determined by the last census.
