AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Production and Conservation of Food Products, for the Purchase of Farm Machinery and for Miscellaneous Expenses authorized by Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the
3 treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary
4 revenue unless otherwise specified, for the fiscal
5 year ending on the thirtieth day of November,
6 nineteen hundred and eighteen, to wit:—

7 For the trustees for former Troop C, First
8 Squadron of Massachusetts Cavalry, the sum of
9 nine hundred thirty-one dollars and thirty-nine
10 cents, as authorized by chapter thirty of the
11 resolves of the present year.

12 For compensating certain persons for the loss
13 of horses hired by the militia in June, nineteen
14 hundred and sixteen, the sum of forty-seven
15 hundred and fifty dollars, as authorized by

16 chapter thirty-two of the resolves of the present
17 year.

18 For Nicholas B. Lake, a sum not exceeding
19 five hundred four dollars and twenty-five cents,
20 as authorized by chapter thirty-three of the
21 resolves of the present year.

22 For expenses in connection with ascertaining
23 the cost of a sewerage system to prevent the
24 pollution of the Mystic lake, a sum not exceeding
25 five hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter
26 thirty-four of the resolves of the present year.

27 For the purpose of promoting and stimulating
28 the production and conservation of food products,
29 a sum not exceeding two hundred thousand
30 dollars, as authorized by chapter sixty-three of
31 the Special Acts of the present year.

32 For the purchase of farm machinery and lease
33 of the same for the use of farmers, a sum not
34 exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, as
35 authorized by chapter ninety of the General Acts
36 of the present year.

37 For certificates of honor to Massachusetts
38 soldiers who served on the Mexican border, a
39 sum not exceeding sixteen hundred dollars, as
40 authorized by chapter ninety-four of the General
41 Acts of the present year.

42 For Ellen F. Cady of Salem, a sum not exceed-
43 ing three hundred dollars, as authorized by
44 chapter thirty-five of the resolves of the present
45 year.

46 For certain expenses in the office of the Na-
47 tional Guard property and disbursing officer, a

48 sum not exceeding eighteen hundred dollars, as
49 authorized by chapter thirty-six of the resolves
50 of the present year.

51 To reimburse the city of Northampton for the
52 support of Smith's Agricultural School and North-
53 ampton School of Industry, the sum of ten
54 thousand six hundred ninety-seven dollars and
55 sixteen cents, as authorized by chapter thirty-
56 seven of the resolves of the present year.

57 For The Norwood Morris Plan Company, the
58 sum of ninety dollars, as authorized by chapter
59 thirty-eight of the resolves of the present year.

60 For the purchase of land adjoining the Wa-
61 chusetts mountain state reservation, the sum of
62 eight hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter
63 thirty-nine of the resolves of the present year.

64 For Alice J. Cropper, widow of J. Wallace
65 Cropper, the sum of five hundred dollars, as
66 authorized by chapter forty of the resolves of the
67 present year, being an extension of chapter ninety
68 of the resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
