RESOLVE

Granting a County Tax for the County of Hampshire.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the following sums are hereby appro-
- 2 priated for the expenses of the county of Hampshire, for
- 3 the year nineteen hundred and eighteen: —
- 4 For interest on county debt, a sum not exceeding six
- 5 thousand dollars.
- 6 For reduction of county debt, a sum not exceeding
- 7 eleven thousand dollars.
- 8 For salaries of county officers and assistants, fixed by
- 9 law, a sum not exceeding eleven thousand five hundred
- 10 dollars.
- 11 For clerical assistance in county offices, a sum not ex-
- 12 ceeding five thousand five hundred dollars.
- 13 For salaries and expenses of district and police courts,
- 14 a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars.
- 15 For salaries of jailers, masters and assistants, and
- 16 support of prisoners in jails and houses of correction, a
- 17 sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars.
- 18 For criminal costs in the superior court, a sum not
- 19 exceeding six thousand dollars.
- 20 For civil expenses in the supreme judicial and superior
- 21 courts, a sum not exceeding four thousand five hundred
- 22 dollars.

23 For sanatorium, a sum not exceeding one thousand
24 dollars.

25 For transportation expenses of county and associate
26 commissioners, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.

27 For medical examiners, inquests, and commitments of
28 the insane, a sum not exceeding two thousand two hun-
29 dred dollars.

30 For auditor, masters and referees, a sum not exceeding
31 one thousand dollars.

32 For building county buildings, a sum not exceeding
33 three thousand dollars.

34 For repairing, furnishing and improving county build-
35 ings, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

36 For fuel, lights and supplies in county buildings, other
37 than jails and houses of correction, and for care of the
38 same, a sum not exceeding seven thousand five hundred
39 dollars.

40 For highways, bridges and land damages, a sum not
41 exceeding sixty-five thousand dollars.

42 For law libraries, a sum not exceeding one thousand
43 two hundred dollars.

44 For training school, a sum not exceeding five hundred
45 dollars.

46 For miscellaneous and contingent expenses of the cur-
47 rent year, a sum not exceeding one thousand five hundred
48 dollars.

49 For Mount Tom reservation, a sum not exceeding
50 eight hundred thirty-four dollars.

51 For pensions, a sum not exceeding eight hundred dol-
52 lars.

53 For The Hampshire County Farm Improvement Bureau,
54 Inc., a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

55 And the county commissioners of said county are
56 hereby authorized to levy as the county tax of said

57 county for the current year, in the manner provided by
58 law, the sum of one hundred sixty thousand five hundred
59 eleven dollars and nine cents, to be expended, together
60 with the cash balance on hand and the receipts from
61 other sources, for the above purposes.
