To accompany the petition of Arthur L. Nason that the salaries of the Board of Parole be established. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen.

AN ACT

To establish the Salaries of the Board of Parole.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section five of chapter two hundred and forty-
2 one of the General Acts of the year nineteen hun-
3 dred and sixteen is hereby amended by striking
4 out the second paragraph thereof and inserting
5 in place thereof the following paragraph:— The
6 chairman of said board shall receive an annual
7 salary of twenty-two hundred dollars, and the
8 other two members of the board, an annual salary
9 of seventeen hundred dollars each as full compen-
10 sation for their duties relative to permits to be
11 at liberty from the state prison, the Massachu-
12 setts reformatory, the prison camp and hospital,

13 and the reformatory for women, and shall be re-
14 imbursed by the commonwealth for actual ex-
15 penses incurred by them in the performance of
16 their official duties, — so that said section five,
17 as amended, shall read as follows: — The three
18 members of the board of parole shall be appointed
19 by the governor with the advice and consent of
20 the council, for terms of three years, two years
21 and one year from the first day of July, nineteen
22 hundred and sixteen, respectively, as the governor
23 shall designate, and thereafter one member shall
24 be appointed annually to serve for the term of
25 three years. The chairman of said board shall
26 receive an annual salary of twenty-two hundred
27 dollars, and the other two members of the board,
28 an annual salary of seventeen hundred dollars
29 each as full compensation for their duties relative to
30 permits to be at liberty from the state prison, the
31 Massachusetts reformatory, the prison camp and
32 hospital, and the reformatory for women, and
33 shall be reimbursed by the commonwealth for
34 actual expenses incurred by them in the perform-
35 ance of their official duties. In addition thereto,
36 the members of said board may receive as com-
37 pensation for the performance of their duties as
38 advisory board of pardons, under the provisions
39 of section six of chapter eight hundred and
40 twenty-nine of the acts of the year nineteen hun-
41 dred and thirteen, and for actual expenses in-
42 curred in connection therewith, such sums from
43 the treasury of the commonwealth as may be

44 approved by the governor with the advice and
45 consent of the council. The governor with the
46 advice and consent of the council shall annually
47 designate one member of the board of parole as
48 chairman. The director of prisons shall furnish
49 the said board with clerical and other necessary
50 assistance.
