AN ACT

To regulate the Mileage Allowance of Members and
Certain Employees of the General Court.

EMERGENCY PREAMBLE.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of the fol-
2 lowing act under the provisions of article forty-
3 eight of the amendments to the constitution
4 would largely defeat its purpose, accordingly the
5 act is hereby declared to be an emergency law,
6 as necessary for the immediate preservation of
7 the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Each member of the general court,
2 and each doorkeeper, assistant doorkeeper, mes-
3 senger and page thereof shall receive as mileage
4 for the regular annual session three dollars for
5 every mile of ordinary travelling distance from
6 his place of abode to the place of sitting of the
7 general court.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter two hundred and two of
2 the General Acts of nineteen hundred and fifteen,
3 chapter six of the General Acts of nineteen hun-
4 dred and seventeen, as amended by chapter
5 sixty-six of the General Acts of nineteen hundred
6 and eighteen, and so much of section eight of
7 chapter three of the Revised Laws, as amended
8 by section one of chapter six hundred and seventy-
9 six of the acts of nineteen hundred and eleven,
10 and by chapter sixty-two of the General Acts of
11 nineteen hundred and eighteen, as is inconsistent
12 herewith, are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage as of the first Wednesday in January of
3 the current year.
