## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO OFFER CERTAIN COURSES FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 7 of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by section 2D of chapter 613 of the acts of 1958, is  
3 hereby further amended by adding at the end the following  
4 paragraph: —

5 The department may also offer courses relating to education,  
6 free of charge, to duly elected school committee members. Said  
7 courses shall include but shall not be limited to subjects dealing  
8 with school law and school administration, curriculum, educa-  
9 tional trends, tests and measurement, guidance and counselling,  
10 the position of the teacher, exceptional children, science and  
11 language growth, educational psychology and philosophy, school  
12 plant management, public relations and duties of school com-  
13 mittee members.
