The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-One.

AN ACT TO ALLOW THE CITY OF BOSTON TO PROMOTE A LOTTERY FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE BOSTON CITY HOSPITAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston shall be authorized to set up
2 and promote a lottery, half of the proceeds of which shall be
3 used exclusively for the support and maintenance of the Boston
4 City hospital and half shall be given as prizes upon the drawing
5 of lottery tickets.

1 SECTION 2. Such lottery tickets shall be sold by and under
2 the authority of the collector of taxes for said city of Boston in
3 such place or places as said collector may designate and the
4 drawing of the prizes shall be under the direction and super-
5 vision of the Boston city council at such times and such places
6 as said city council may determine.
