AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAW CONCERNING EQUAL PAY FOR MEN AND WOMEN TEACHERS IN CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to  
2 defeat one of its purposes, which is to prevent the operation of  
3 chapter three hundred and forty-four of the acts of nineteen  
4 hundred and sixty before the town elections of nineteen hundred  
5 and sixty-one, before it is hereby declared to be an emergency  
6 law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
7 convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter three hundred and forty-four of the  
2 acts of nineteen hundred and sixty is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
