AN ACT PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THE CITY OF BOSTON BY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS WHO TOW AWAY ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 263 of the acts of 1929 is
2 hereby amended by inserting after the fourth sentence, as most
3 recently amended by chapter 315 of the acts of 1955, the follow-
4 ing sentence: — Each independent contractor who so removes
5 a vehicle, shall pay over to the city of Boston the sum of two
6 dollars from the lawful charge made to the owner of said vehicle,
7 said monies to be paid quarterly to the collector-treasurer of the
8 city accompanied by a notarized itemized statement of the num-
9 ber of cars towed away and the amounts collected therefor.

By the Senate the following bill was passed

As the Senate has passed the following bill in the City of Boston
at its regular session on the 21st day of January
1884

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in the City of Boston
that the following bill be passed, with amendments thereto, as follows:

1.
