By Mr. Patrone of Boston, petition of Charles L. Patrone and another for permitting the issuance of a replacement or duplicate license for operators of motor vehicles who are in the military service. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

AN ACT PERMITTING THE ISSUANCE OF EITHER A REPLACEMENT OR A DUPLICATE OF AN OPERATOR'S LICENSE FOR MEN IN MILITARY SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 23A of chapter 708 of the acts of 1941, inserted by
2 section 51 of chapter 627 of the acts of 1954, and as last amended
3 by chapter 507 of the acts of 1955, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out the paragraph which reads as follows: "If the
5 license of such person is lost or mutilated, a duplicate thereof
6 shall be furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles without
7 fee and upon presentation of the evidence aforesaid," and sub-
8 stituting therefor the following paragraph: —

9 If the license of such person is lost or mutilated, a duplicate
10 or replacement thereof shall be furnished by the registrar of
11 motor vehicles without fee and upon presentation of the evidence
12 aforesaid.

Report of the Commission on Government

The Commission on Government was organized in 1955 to study the structure and functions of the Federal Government and to recommend ways to improve its efficiency and effectiveness.

The Commission's work has been carried out through a series of public hearings, extensive consultations with interested groups, and a thorough review of the literature on government organization.

The Commission's report is divided into two main parts. The first part, "The Structure of Government," examines the existing organization of the Federal Government and identifies areas where changes are needed. The second part, "Recommendations," sets forth the Commission's proposals for reorganizing the Federal Government to achieve greater efficiency and effectiveness.

The Commission believes that the changes recommended in this report are essential for the Federal Government to meet the challenges of the future. We urge the Congress to take prompt action on these recommendations.
