AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO RESURFACE OCEAN AVENUE IN THE CITY OF REVERE AND TO INSTALL NEW LIGHTING FACILITIES THEREON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized
- 2 and directed to resurface Ocean avenue in the city of Revere
- 3 and to install new lighting facilities thereon. The said com-
- 4 mission may expend for such purposes such sums as may be
- 5 appropriated therefor.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

1. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
2. No State shall have a greater Number of Representatives than the whole Number of free Persons, including free Persons of African Descent, who in any State shall be entitled to Vote for Electors in the State Legislature.
3. No Representative shall serve for more than two Years, but he may be re-elected.
4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
5. Appropriated funds.
