AN ACT TO PROMOTE THE EFFICIENT OPERATION OF THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 19 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 174 of the acts of 1955, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the second sentence in the first
4 paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following new sen-
5 tence: — Within forty-eight hours, not counting Sundays and
6 legal holidays, after the occurrence of a personal injury which
7 causes the loss of at least one day or one shift, usually eight hours,
8 a written report thereof shall be made to the division on blank
9 forms prescribed by it.
