The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-One.

AN ACT AMENDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF BARBERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 39, as most recently amended by section 1 of
3 chapter 509 of the acts of 1947, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following section:—

5 *Section 39.* There shall be a board of registration of barbers,
6 in this section and in sections forty and forty-one called the
7 board, to be appointed by the governor, with the advice and
8 consent of the council, and to consist of three members, citi-
9 zens of the commonwealth, each of whom shall be a practicing
10 barber, and shall have had five years of practical experience as
11 a barber in this commonwealth prior to his original appoint-
12 ment and shall have been actively engaged in the occupation
13 of barbering in this commonwealth for not less than six months
14 during the twelve months immediately prior to such appoint-
15 ment, and at least one of whom shall be [a master barber] an
16 **active member of the Associated Master Barbers and**
17 **Beauticians of Massachusetts**, and at least one of whom shall
18 be [a journeyman] **an active member of the Journeyman**
19 **Barbers, Hairdressers, Cosmetologists and Proprietors**
20 **International Union of Massachusetts**. No two members
21 of the board shall while in office be engaged in practicing the
22 occupation of barbering in the same town. As the term of office
23 of a member expires his successor shall be appointed by the gov-
24 ernor, with like advice and consent, to serve for three years.
25 The governor may also, with like advice and consent, fill any
26 vacancy in the board for the unexpired portion of the term.
