## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-One.

AN ACT AMENDING THE LAW WHICH PROVIDES LEAVE WITHOUT LOSS OF PAY FOR CERTAIN INCAPACITATED POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 111F of chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by inserting before the last sentence the following sen-  
3 tence: — This section shall also apply to a police officer who is  
4 assigned to special duty by a superior officer and who is inca-  
5 pacitated for duty because of injury sustained in the perform-  
6 ance of such duty without fault of his own, whether such police  
7 officer is paid for such special duty by the city, town, district  
8 or otherwise.

The Constitution of the State

As amended by the People of the State

ARTICLE I. OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

SECTION 1. The legislative power of this State shall be vested in a Senate and Assembly, which shall be styled the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four Members, who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State, and shall hold their offices for the term of two years, and until their successors be chosen. The Assembly shall be composed of fifty Members, who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State, and shall hold their offices for the term of one year, and until their successors be chosen. The Senate and Assembly shall meet annually on the first Monday of January, and on the first Monday of January of every second year thereafter, and on such other days as may be required by law. The Senate shall assemble on the first Monday of January, and the Assembly on the first Monday of January following. The Senate and Assembly shall hold their sessions in the City of New York, and in such other places as may be determined by law. The Senate and Assembly shall be organized on the first Monday of January following their election, and shall continue to hold their sessions until their successors be chosen.
