AN ACT EXTENDING THE METROPOLITAN PARKS DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 33 of chapter 92 of the General Laws, as
- 2 appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by
- 3 striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof
- 4 the following sentence: The commission may acquire, main-
- 5 tain and make available to the inhabitants of Arlington, Avon,

- 7 Burlington, Cambridge, Canton, Chelsea, Cohasset, Concord,
- 8 Danvers, Dedham, Dover, Everett, Hingham, Holbrook, Hull,
- 9 Lexington, Lincoln, Lynn, Lynnfield, Malden, Marblehead,
- 10 Medfield, Medford, Melrose, Middleton, Milton, Nahant,
- 11 Natick, Needham, Newton, North Reading, Norwood, Peabody,
- 12 Quincy, Randolph, Reading, Revere, Salem, Saugus, Sharon,
- 13 Somerville, Stoneham, Stoughton, Swampscott, Wakefield,
- 14 W. I. I. W. I. W. I. I. W.
- 14 Walpole, Waltham, Watertown, Wayland, Wellesley, Weston,
- 15 Westwood, Weymouth, Wilmington, Winchester, Winthrop and
- 16 Woburn, which shall constitute the metropolitan parks district,
- 17 open spaces for exercise and recreation, in this chapter called
- 18 reservations; and, for the purpose set forth in this section, the
- 19 jurisdiction and powers of the commission shall extend to, and
- 20 be exercised in, said district.
