By Mr. Keenan of Boston, petition of William Francis Keenan for legislation making certain persons eligible for membership in the contributory retirement system. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-One.

AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (d) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32 of
2 the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of
3 chapter 578 of the acts of 1958, is hereby further amended by
4 adding at the end the following two sentences: — Any employee
5 otherwise eligible for membership and not having attained the
6 maximum age for his group, who has been determined to be in
7 any of the categories specified in this section, shall nevertheless,
8 if he has been employed full time for a period of six months, be
9 eligible for membership. If such a person thereafter becomes a
10 member in service, he shall receive credit for the service previ-
11 ously rendered if he shall have paid into the annuity savings
12 fund of the system an amount equal to that which would have
13 been withheld as regular deductions from his regular compensa-
14 tion had he been a member in service, together with interest.
