AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN JUDGES OF PROBATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 217 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 34, as most recently amended by section 1 of
3 chapter 736 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following section:—

5 *Section 34.* The salaries of all judges of probate shall be paid
6 by the commonwealth and are hereby established as follows:—
