### AN ACT RELATIVE TO APPOINTMENT OF EMPLOYEES IN THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 9 of chapter 125 of the General Laws, as most re-  
2 cently amended by chapter 201 of the acts of 1960, is hereby  
3 further amended by striking out the last paragraph and insert-  
4 ing in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no  
6 person who has been convicted of a felony or who has been  
7 confined in any house of correction, prison or adult reformatory,  
8 excluding institutions for juvenile delinquents, shall be appointed  
9 to any position in the department of correction, the duties of  
10 which involve personal and direct contact with prisoners.
