AN ACT REQUIRING THAT A MASSACHUSETTS REGISTERED SANITARIAN BE EMPLOYED BY LOCAL BOARDS OF HEALTH AND DEPARTMENTS OF HEALTH FOR SANITARY INSPECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 26E the following section:—
3 *Section 26F.* No person shall be employed by a local board of
4 health or health department for the purpose of making sanitary
5 inspections, which include food, water and milk inspections and
6 inspections of facilities and plants concerned with food, water,
7 milk, sewage disposal and housing and such other inspections
8 related thereto, as either the board or department may see fit
9 to be made under its jurisdiction, unless said person is regis-
10 tered as a sanitarian under the provisions of chapter one hundred
11 and twelve of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section one of this act shall not
2 apply to an engineer registered under the provisions of chapter
3 one hundred and twelve and employed as a consultant by a
4 board of health or health department, nor to a plumbing in-
5 spector performing the duties of his office, nor to any person
6 employed on the effective date of this act by any board of health
7 or health department and performing the duties described in
8 section one of this act.
