
By Mr. Nolen of Ware, petition of Michael T. Moriarty and others that persons entering state service within five years of termination of military service be given credit for such military service under the contributory retirement law. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

AN ACT PROVIDING MILITARY SERVICE CREDIT FOR MEMBERS OF THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW, WHO ENTERED INTO STATE SERVICE WITHIN FIVE YEARS OF TERMINATION OF SUCH MILITARY SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) of section 4 of chapter 32 of
2 the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the third
3 subparagraph, as recently amended by section 4 of chapter 597
4 of the acts of 1961, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 subparagraph: —

6 Any member who served in the armed forces between Janu-
7 ary first, nineteen hundred and forty and July first, nineteen
8 hundred and sixty-two, shall have such actual service credited
9 to him as creditable service, if within five years of his release or
10 discharge from such service, he is employed, re-employed or re-
11 instated into state service. The provisions of sections nine and
12 nine A of chapter seven hundred and eight of the acts of nine-
13 teen hundred and forty-one, as amended, and as may be further
14 amended, shall be applicable to any person referred to in sec-
15 tion one of said chapter seven hundred and eight who is a mem-
16 ber of any retirement system established under the provisions
17 of this chapter whose last discharge or release from military
18 service was under honorable conditions as defined in defense de-
19 partment regulations.
