AN ACT TO DESIGNATE A DEPUTY ASSISTANT REGISTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 217 of the General Laws is hereby amended by add-
2 ing the following new section 29A:—

3 *Section 29A.* The register for each county, except Suffolk
4 and Middlesex counties, may designate such employee in his
5 office, as in his judgment may be necessary for the convenience
6 of the public as deputy assistant register, with the same powers
7 as assistant registers and may revoke any such designation at
8 pleasure.
