By Mr. Wicher of Marshfield, petition of Laurence D. Watson and others that provision be made for life tenure for the incumbent of the office of chief fire engineer of the town of Pembroke. Towns.

AN ACT PROVIDING LIFE TENURE FOR THE INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF FIRE ENGINEER OF THE TOWN OF PEMBROKE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The tenure of office of the incumbent of the office
2 of chief fire engineer of the town of Pembroke, shall upon the
3 effective date of this act, be unlimited, but he may be removed
4 therefrom for just cause and for reasons specifically given him
5 in writing by the board of selectmen in the manner provided by
6 section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the voters of said
2 town at the annual town meeting to be held in the current year
3 in the form of the following question, which shall be placed
4 upon the official ballot to be used for the election of town officers
5 at said meeting:— "Shall an act passed by the General Court
6 in the year nineteen hundred sixty-three, entitled 'An Act
7 providing life tenure for the incumbent of the office of chief fire
8 engineer of the town of Pembroke', be accepted?" If a majority
9 of the votes in answer to said question is in the affirmative, this
10 act shall thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
