AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as amended,
2 is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence of
3 the second paragraph, as appearing in section 4 of chapter 459
4 of the acts of 1935, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence: — The commissioner shall, annually on or before Sep-
6 tember fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation, fix and
7 establish **fair and reasonable classifications of risks, and**
8 **adequate, just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory premium**
9 **charges to be used and charged by companies in connection with**
10 **the issue or execution of motor vehicle liability policies or bonds,**
11 **both as defined in section thirty-four A of chapter ninety,**
12 **for the ensuing calendar year on any part thereof. But said**
13 **classifications and premium charges shall be uniform**
14 **throughout the commonwealth and shall not be fixed**
15 **or established according to districts or zones.**

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS AND THE MAINTENANCE OF THE REGISTER.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in Session assembled, February 1, 1900.

SECTION 1. The Board of Registrars shall be composed of the Governor, the Lieutenant-Governor, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, the Justices of the Superior Court, and the Justices of the District Court, and shall hold office for one year from the first day of January next following their appointment, and until their successors are appointed.

SECTION 2. The Board of Registrars shall have the honor of the seal of the Commonwealth, and shall exercise and discharge the powers and duties conferred upon them by this act, and all such powers and duties as may be conferred upon them by any other act of the Legislature.
